

Dear Covenant Partners, Active Supporters, and Friends,

On Monday, June 10 a meeting was held with those who have led <u>adult and youth small groups</u> in the past year. It was an important time to think and pray and envision what God wants us to do to keep growing, maturing, and multiplying disciples at UPVPC. When asked about the current small groups, the following descriptors of 'what we do' were shared:

- † We study the Bible
- † We build relationships & bond with one another
- † We try to instill a hunger for God's Word
- † We share encouraging stories from our week
- † We make sure we are leading with a healthy awareness of different levels of Bible knowledge in the room
- † We pray for and support one another
- † We create a safe place to talk about difficult things
- † We encourage, reach out, and take care of each other
- † We challenge each other to be and make disciples every day of the week, no matter where we are

We spoke at length about what/who is missing in our groups. We celebrated a healthy multi-generational mix in all of the adult classes and agreed that we want to continue this, promoting it as the best way for a church family to learn and grow from one another. The challenges of the young and the challenges of the old help us get outside ourselves to share wisdom and hope with one another as followers of Jesus Christ. We discussed ways to integrate new high school graduates and college students into the adult small group ministry. If you are not currently engaged in a small group on Sunday mornings or Wednesday evenings, I enthusiastically encourage you to take a step of faith and give one a try.

We also put <u>Confirmation</u> on the table for discussion. Confirmation in the Presbyterian Church has always happened before age 15 as a class experience designed to teach the foundations of the faith to teens. The goal is help them make faith their own by choosing and professing faith in Jesus and making a commitment to covenant partnership - an important step to adulthood and maturation as a disciple. We are launching a new model for confirmation at UPVPC.

We agreed whole-heartedly that a more personal approach needs to be taken with our teens who express a readiness to profess their faith in Christ and become covenant partners of the church. Therefore, with a team of mentors at-the-ready, using a modified version of my covenant partner class curriculum, we are prepared to offer this important relationship-driven ministry to our teens. The current mentors ready to serve are: Joni Frey, Becky Gerlach, Bonnie Cornelious, and Chris Walters for our girls, and John Boozer and Karl Barry for our boys. This will be a one-on-one or two-on-one experience – as God leads. If you have a teen in your household who is ready to make a commitment to Christ and the church, please speak directly with me or Laurie Ruby to get the ball rolling. The timing for this will be extremely flexible, but a commitment to agreed-upon meeting times will be a critical part of bringing your teen to this new place in their lives.

We concluded our meeting with things we celebrate in our small group discipleship ministry at UPVPC: The new classroom, inclusiveness (all are welcome no matter what hindrance you might think somehow disqualifies you – not true!), loving direction, teens learning Scripture, laughter, love, fellowship, relationships, safe spaces, the freedom to change groups when desired, and one another. I am beyond grateful to God for what He is doing in us, through us, and with us. Let us press on, inviting others, and committed to the full ripening of the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.


