

Dear Covenant Partners, Active Supporters, and Friends,

The months of summer are upon us, and certainly this summer is going to look a lot different than any summer I've ever lived through. Due to the COVID-19 Global Pandemic (that quarantined us from one another starting in March 2020) we are in a time of being very careful & cautious as we (finally) begin to plan & implement in-person gatherings on the church property. We are watching the statistics, reading the CDC guidelines, and most importantly listening to God - the <u>One Consistent Voice</u> of reason and truth. We are making progress, slow though it may be.

This past Sunday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, the Day of Pentecost, we offered a full online worship service as well as an in-person outdoor time of worship. The plan was clear:

- 1. Gather on the front lawn at 10 a.m.
- 2. Bring your own chair.
- 3. Wear a mask until you have found your spot to set up your chair(s). If you have to get up and move, put your mask back on.

4. Set up a minimum of 6' apart from others that you have not already been around in the last weeks. Approximately 90 people came together and followed the guidelines that we sent out ahead of time. It was truly wonderful to actually see the faces of the people I've been preaching to online for the last 12 weeks. God gave us a glorious day to begin this new way of gathering. At this point, we are planning to do the same thing for this coming Sunday, June 7. If it is raining, or if there is a significant threat of rain, we will worship only online. We (the elders, relaunch team, and staff) are going to make decisions about worship on a week to week basis as of now. Though there are a minimal number of COVID-19 cases in the valleys in which most of us live, many of us work in Chambersburg where the numbers are high and still rising. We proceed carefully, cautiously, and we pray, faithfully.

Before we stopped meeting together on the church property back in March we had started a Lenten study entitled <u>Something Needs to Change</u> by Pastor David Platt. The subtitle of the book is *Making Your Life Count in a World of Urgent Need*. We, of course, had no idea what was about to happen. We only shared two weeks of eight in the study before we were separated. But don't you think it is interesting that we started a study called <u>Something Needs to Change</u> right before we were quarantined? I do. The God we serve doesn't waste anything. He doesn't waste any opportunity to call us to repentance (meaning: *change*). He doesn't waste any opportunity to call us to reveal his presence to us – to reveal his involvement in the details of our lives.

What has changed in and with you since the middle of March? Have you grown in your faith? Have you found new ways to show your devotion to him? Have you settled into a different routine for your daily Bible reading? Have you discovered deeper paths to prayer? Some things did need to change in me. God revealed some things in my life that needed his healing hand, his unfailing love, his ever-steadying truth. I am hopeful about this next season of ministry at UPVPC. I am hopeful for new believers, maturing disciples, and new ways to share & spread the gospel. Keep praying, church. God's got this.

## Words to Ponder Dr. Bonnie Cornelious

One of the requests that people voice in a counseling relationship is to find comfort. I believe that what they are seeking is peace. I understand what they are saying because we hear so often "I'm just not comfortable with that." or "I would like to be comfortable with my decision." or "Why don't I deserve to feel comfortable?"

In my search of the biblical meaning of comfort, I, young modern that I am (NOT), I sought information through Google. Every biblical reference to comfort that I could find relates to God comforting believers in good times and challenging times and instilling His peace in us. There is a difference in being comforted and being comfortable. I'm usually cold so being comfortable is anything above 72 degrees, but that has little to do with Paul's truth to be content in whatever state he found himself.

In the 70's there was an expression "if it feels good, do it," and I think many of my clients still abide by that dictum. I fear that sometimes I fall into that trap too and am called to repentance. Doing what's right is often not comfortable. Proverbs 14:12 tells us "There is a way that appears to be right, but in the end it leads to death."

In answer to deserving to feel comfortable, which I interpret to mean being without troubles or problems, I can refer to John 16:33, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." "As for asking God to rid us of our troubles, it would help to remember, as Rabbi Yitzchok Hutnerz'l said, that 'the purpose of prayer is not to get us out of trouble. The purpose of trouble is to get us into prayer." (David C. Cook lesson)

I thank God for the opportunity and privilege that I have in meeting with each person I see. I learn so much, and, with God's help, I pray that my witness helps them to seek a path to peace.

For them, for you, and for myself I pray God's words from Romans 15:13: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit," the comforter that God sent to live in us. Amen

We have been given the green light to meet on campus again (either outside or in the Assembly Room) and plan to resume Wednesday night in-person gatherings on June 3<sup>rd</sup> from 7-8 pm. #### PRAYER WALK on the UPVPC Grounds OR at Home

This prayer walk represents our ongoing, step-by-step commitment to pray for this next, new season in the life of our congregation. Some ministries, attitudes, programs, & practices have been cut off that were not bearing fruit for the Kingdom. Some ministries, attitudes, programs, & practices have been pruned because they were only bearing 'man-made' fruit not God-made fruit. Some things have been revealed in us as individuals and as a church family during quarantine that are not things of which we are proud. Some things have been revealed to us about the way we use (and perhaps waste) our time, our money, and our gifts, talents, & skills. Walking and praying either out loud or silently is a helpful way to invite God to do what only He can do: heal us, restore us, revive us, and renew our bodies, our minds, and our souls for this next season. Let us ask God for his guidance for our congregation and for His blessing as we seek Him & follow Him with all our heart. Let us ask God for an outpouring of the revelation of Jesus in our lives, our homes, our communities, our state, our nation, and in all the world. Take your time. If you are praying on the property: If someone is behind you & you feel rushed, let them "go around" you as you walk and pray. Please keep at least 6' distance between you and others. May our prayers ascend to the Father in unity with His will for us.

- Thanksgiving: We begin this walk (or drive around) with thanksgiving. Tell God how thankful you are for all He has done for you. We do not lay our requests before him without first speaking words of thanksgiving. Philippians 4:6,7: "<sup>6</sup> Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.<sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
- 2. Confession: Confess the things that are on your heart that God has revealed to you ways that you as an individual, and that we as a church body have not done as God has called us to do, or done what God has not called us to do. How have we dishonored His name on this property? How have we spoken against our brothers and sisters on this property? How have we neglected the true purpose of the church? How have we kept others 'out' who wanted to belong? How have we neglected to serve the most vulnerable? Etc, etc., etc...
- 3. **Repentance:** Repentance means to turn around and go the other way. This is a time to speak your

words of intention to God. We have confessed, now it is time to make a commitment to change, to being transformed by the Spirit of God. I repent (of the things you/we were led to confess). Revival starts with each one turning back to God.

- 4. Receiving forgiveness & mercy: This is where we open our heart to all His goodness, all His mercy, all His love, and all His forgiveness. This is where we open our hands to receive what only God can give: acceptance, unconditional love, and a new start for us and for our church family.
- 5. Re-filling of the Spirit, healing, wholeness: A continuation of the previous prayer of receiving now we pray for the Holy Spirit to refill us (or fill us if you have never been filled before!). Come, Holy Spirit, fill me up and bring healing and wholeness to yourself as an individual and to our whole congregation. Fill us up, Lord. Fill us up until our cup is overflowing!

WEATHER PERMITTING and IF <u>YOU</u> ARE COMFORTABLE GATHERING IN PERSON:

- 1. Gather for worship at 10 a.m. on the lawn in front of the UPVPC sanctuary.
- 2. Bring a Bible and your own chair if possible.
- 3. Please park according to your physical strength. If you need to park close to where we are gathering, please do so. If you don't, please park around back, in the cemetery lot, by the kitchen entrance, or along the road by the cemetery.
- 4. Please <u>maintain</u> 6' distance between you and people you have not already been around in the last several weeks.
- 5. Please <u>sit at least 6' from people you have not been around in the last several weeks</u>.
- 6. Thank you for showing care, compassion, & respect for <u>everyone</u> in the following ways:
  - a. Please wear a <u>mask</u> until you are seated, then you may remove your mask.
  - b. If you get up to move around, please put your mask back on.
- 7. If you have children with you, please make sure they understand their boundaries.
- 8. ONLY one door (off the patio) will be open if you need to use the bathroom, but please try to avoid this if at all possible. If you park in the back, please note that you will have to walk <u>around</u> the building to the worship site.
- 9. Please bring your own coffee/tea or water. None will be provided.
- 10.Before and after worship, you are encouraged to 'prayer walk' around the perimeter of the church property to cover it in prayer. We have 20 signs to guide you in this. This prayer walk will remain in place for weeks so you can come multiple times on your own.
- 11. There will continue to be online worship as we have been offering for the past 12 weeks for those who are not able or not yet comfortable regathering. Whether we are worshipping in one place, or worshipping at home, the blood of Jesus Christ unites us.
- 12.If it is raining, or if there is a significant threat of rain, we will ONLY meet ONLINE as we have been doing. If at all possible, that decision will be made the night before and widely communicated. If you are not sure, call Rev. Meagan at 717-360-4878.
